MISSION STATEMENT

Berean Christian Academy's mission is to educate students in a Christ-centered worldview, equipped to recognize Truth, Goodness, and Beauty in God's Creation. Berean operates as a partnership between faculty and parents, preparing students to live their lives for the glory of Christ and benefit of others.

SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY -

Berean is a Kindergarten through 12th grade independent, interdenominational, classical Christian school founded in 2016 and located just outside of the greater Houston area. The academy's student-faculty ratio is 6:1 with an average class size of 12 which allows for individual feedback and encouragement. Berean's faculty are all degreed in their respective fields and 72% of the Upper School faculty have advanced degrees. Berean Christian Academy is focused on creating a strong educational foundation that builds upon the skills and knowledge developed each year, creating higher-order thinking as the child grows.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM AND DISTINCTIVES —

As a classical Christian school, Berean utilizes the time tested learning model of the seven liberal arts. The Grammar, Logic, and Rhetoric stages are the first three of the seven liberal arts. In the Grammar stage (K-6th grade), students learn the key who, what, when, and where of all their subject matter with a focus on math and Latin. In the Logic stage (7th-9th grade), students explore independent thinking and reasoning, seeking truth by probing the student for sound argument and application of what they are learning. Through formal logic and debate classes, Harkness Table conversation, Latin, and research students test the integrity of ideas and explore differing opinions. The Rhetoric student (10th-12th grade) takes the knowledge and understanding that he has developed in past years and begins to impart wisdom through eloquent and beautiful conversations and writings, focused on highlighting truth. With deeper study into the "great books," original ancient texts, theology, philosophy, and the masters of oratory, the student persuasively defends his thoughts and ideas. The capstone of this stage is modeled through a 12th grade Senior Thesis. In addition to implementing the intensive classical approach, all students are continually involved in service projects, leadership opportunities, virtue development, and mentorships.

Admissions requirements include entrance exams, transcript screening, teacher recommendations and inperson interviews of students and families.

UNIQUE OPPORTUNITIES

200 Hours of Extracurriculars Per Year

Recognizing that all learning cannot happen in the classroom, all students, K-12, are required to log 200 hours of extracurricular learning, experiences, or service that happen outside of the classroom each year. Students are able to pursue opportunities that meet their personal passions and interests as they grow as well rounded individuals.

Capstones to the Logic School - Science Fair and Mock Trial

Students in 7th-9th grade participate twice in a science fair and at least once in Mock Trial. Science Fair is an individual learning opportunity with a focus on research and utilization of the Scientific Method while Mock Trial is a cooperative exercise allowing students to learn about the judicial system, read and analyze legal documents, prepare persuasive statements, integrate information from several sources, and create and deliver oral presentations. The culmination of Science Fair is an oral presentation of the students' findings in front of a panel of judges and peers. Mock Trial's presentation is presided over by a local judge and a jury composed of members of the community.

Capstone to the Rhetoric School - Senior Thesis

The culmination of a BCA education can be seen in the capstone project of Senior Thesis, a requirement for a Berean graduation. With the help of a Rhetoric instructor and a faculty advisor, the students research, write, memorize, and present a 15-20 page paper. The student then has the opportunity to defend their thesis to a panel of judges made up of members of the community, experts, and peers. This opportunity offers students a chance to put into practice the skills they have cultivated over the course of their educational journey at BCA: the Canons of Rhetoric and the modes of persuasion, as well as professional academic research. Students graduate with a firm understanding of completing academic research, evaluating arguments, and presenting a public defense of their ideas.

Community and International Service

All students, K-12, have community service opportunities built into their year. Students recognize the need and responsibility to use their education and resources to be the hands and feet of Christ to the world around them. Examples include: Providing Christmas to all children at International Treasure House Ministries of Kenya, Hope Pregnancy Center, Katy Christian Ministries, Samaritan's Purse, aiding local senior citizens, and visiting nursing homes, veterans, and special needs adults.

BCA House System - Student Government

The Logic and Rhetoric School House System provides opportunities for student body leadership, community and international service/missions, friendly competition and deep community. Students operate their Houses as a counsel where officers hold monthly meetings, host school-wide events, and manage a budget.

Mentorship

Every upper school student weekly partners with a community leader in a mentorship program where they discuss complex issues about the world in preparation to selflessly impact their community now and after graduation.

Competitive Athletics

Offerings for students include Men's Flag Football, Women's Volleyball, Men's and Women's Cross Country, Basketball, Track and Field, Golf and Tennis. Students compete in the Texas Charter School Academic & Athletic League (TCSAAL) and West Houston Christian Athletic Conference (WHCAC).
